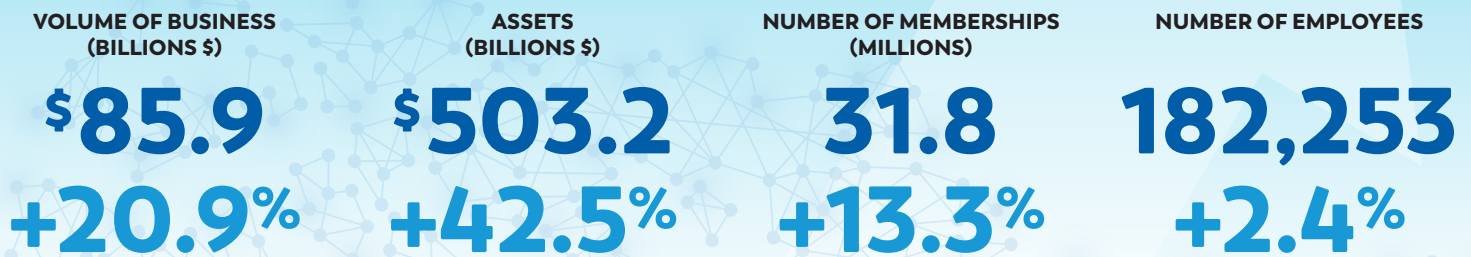
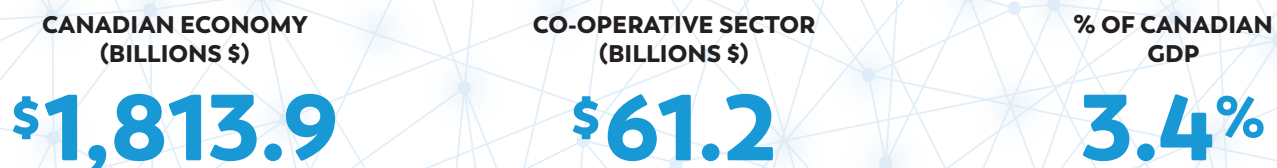
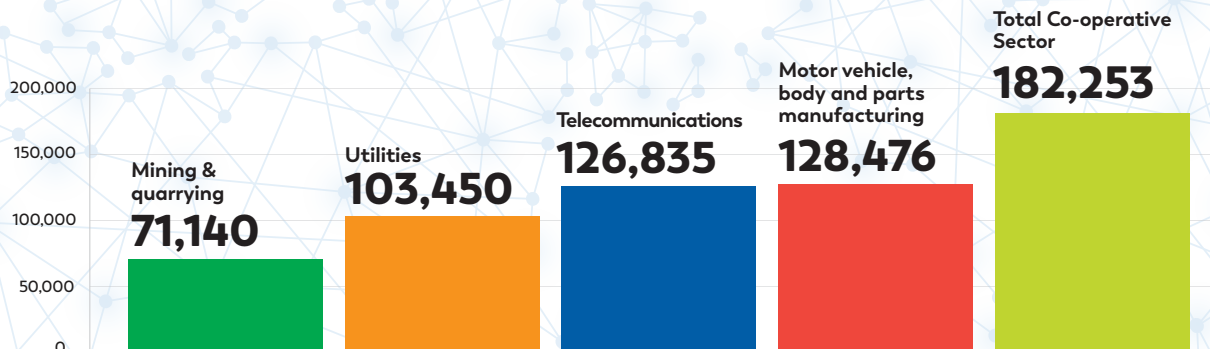

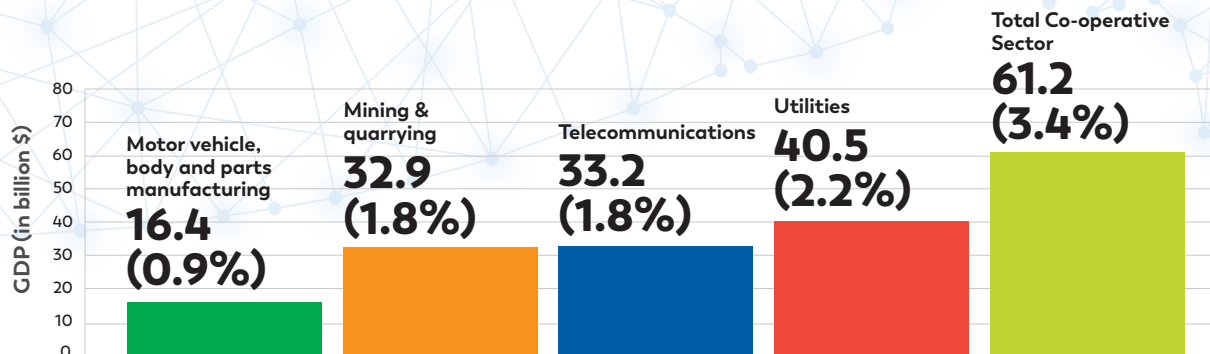
GROWTH RATE OF THE CO-OPERATIVE SECTOR IN CANADA FROM 2010-2015

Co-ops are key economic players across Canada open to increased participation in the economy by newcomers, Indigenous people, youth, and women entrepreneurs.

In Quebec, 3,000 co-operatives and mutuels represent 116,000 jobs and 8 million memberships, making it the strongest network in Canada. These include:

Housing

- The average 2 bedroom co-op residence costs approximately 30% less than a condo.
- In housing markets like Vancouver and Toronto, the co-op difference is approximately 53%.
- In Canada, 90,000 households live in 2,212 housing co-operatives.

Childcare

- 375 daycare and preschool co-operatives serve 34,000 families.
- Co-ops reduce costs up to 50%, according to a UK study.

Funeral

- Services are 41% less expensive when provided by a funeral co-operative.
- There are more than 50 funeral co-operatives in communities across Canada.

Seniors

- Co-ops provide housing solutions as well as Assisted Living, Health, Social, Recreational and Home Care services.
- In Quebec, up to 29% of healthcare co-op members are over the age of 65, allowing them to have proximity health services.
